BEFORE SCHOOL SUPERVISION

Active and Safe Travel: Parent Survey

The Active and Safe mapping program is designed to encourage families to park their vehicles up to 800 metres away from school entry points in order to reduce traffic congestion and increase road safety awareness in and around the school community. The maps will highlight alternative parking locations, safer walking routes and provide education focused on school based road safety and active/sustainable travel.

Parking at alternative locations to the school car park is a great way to include some exercise and fresh air into your day. You can use this time to teach your children road safety awareness, confidence and independence by learning a particular walking route. Take the opportunity to chat with your children about their school day on the way to school in the morning or on the way back to the car in the afternoon.

Your responses to the survey will assist in providing important road safety and active travel information to Council to assist in developing targeted Road Safety and Travel Choice programs for the Moreton Bay Region. Any information you provide will remain confidential.
