PRINCIPAL'S SAY

Welcome back to Term 3 and it has been a very hectic start after my leave at the end of last term. I had a beautiful time with my family as we celebrated our eldest daughter's wedding. Thank you to all those who sent the wishes and congratulations, it was very much appreciated.

We also have cause for CELEBRATION here at Tullawong State School with the impressive academic results for Semester 1. It has been another busy start to Term 3 but all our students have settled into routines quickly and the level of engagement already in classrooms is impressive. There has been improvement across the whole school and we will be one of the most improved schools in the region looking at our English data.



In the Early from PREP to Year 2 we had 75% of students achieving a 'C' standard or better. This is an improvement of 8% from the end of last year. In the Upper School from Year 3 to Year 6 we had 81% of students achieving 'C' standard or better. This is an improvement of 14%. Across the whole school from Prep to Year 6 we had 79% of students achieving 'C' standard or better and that is an incredible increase of 10%.

I hope you will join me in thanking the staff and students for their hard work that was done for these outstanding results. I would also like to thank all the parents and carers for being involved and working with the staff to create the learning environment that is nurturing the student's growth.

Remember the important factors such as:

- Talking to your children positively about school. Be curious and interested in what they are learning about and talking about.
- Taking time to ensure they read and are read to EVERY DAY
- Making sure that they attend school EVERY DAY unless sick
- Limiting their screen time
- Communicating and partnering with teachers

Let's build on our success last semester and celebrate some more at the end of the year.

ABSENCES

To notify student absences please select one of the following:

- Phone the student absence line: 5431 4660
- Phone the school: 5431 4666 and select option 1
- Written letter from parent/carer

If we are not notified of an absence by 10:00am we will text parents/carers as a reminder. It is essential you reply to this text with student's name, class and reason to stop follow up texts being sent and an unexplained absence being recorded.

LATE ARRIVALS

All students arriving after 8:40am must obtain a late slip from the Communication Room.

Students will be marked absent until a late slip has been generated. You may receive a text to notify you of your student's absence if there is a delay in obtaining a late slip.

EARLY DEPARTURES

If you are collecting your child before 2:35pm you should pre-arrange this by sending a note or advising the teacher in the morning to send them to the office at the time of collection. In emergency cases where you need to come to the school please call so your child is ready at the office upon your arrival.

Parents must wait at the office for students as adults are not authorised to walk through the school. Please be aware if you arrive during a lunch break you may need to wait until students return to class.

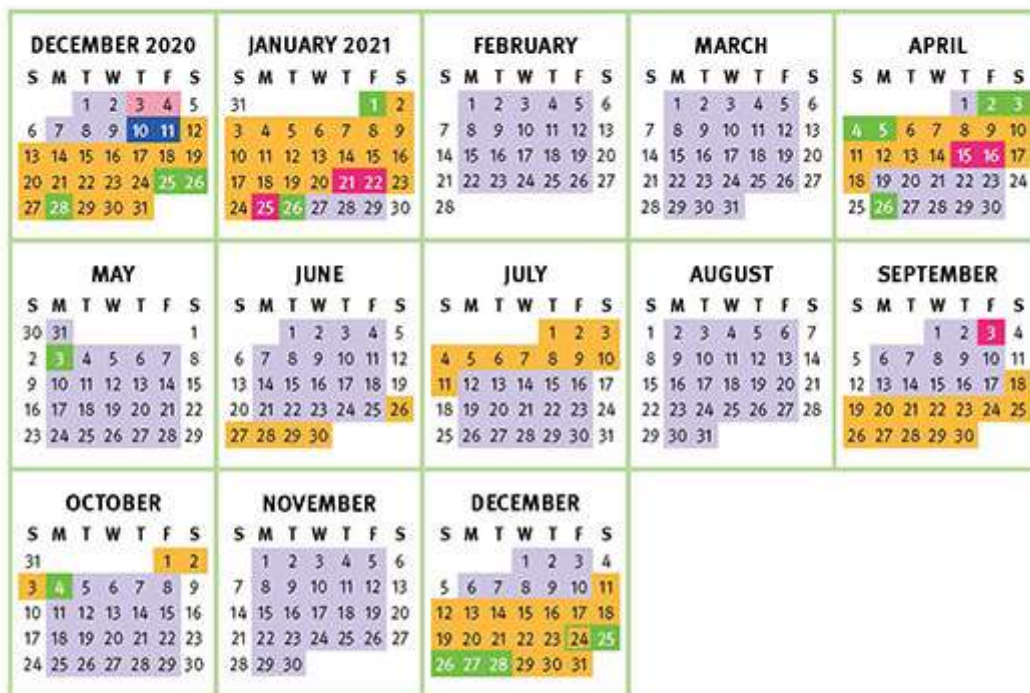
LONG ABSENCES:

STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS

Staff professional development days for teachers are 21 and 22 January, 15 and 16 April and 3 September 2021. Schools are able to decide when they undertake the required hours for professional development for the flexible days, as long as they are on the flexible days, in the school holidays or out of school hours.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Queensland public holidays are set by the Industrial Relations Minister.

Public holidays for local show days are not shown due to diversity of dates across the state.

FINAL DATES FOR STUDENT ATTENDANCE

19 November is the final date for Year 12 attendance for receipt of a Senior Statement. 26 November is the final date for student attendance in Years 10 and 11.

Some schools in regional, rural and remote areas will close for the summer holidays on 3 December.

SAFE SCHOOL TRAVEL-KANGAROO BUS LINES

The first half of the year has flown by as we prepare ourselves for Term 3. We are touching base with our schools and parents to bring to your attention a concern we have regarding the behaviour of students whilst travelling on the bus. It is disappointing for all involved that unsafe behaviour is increasing.

KBL is committed to the safety of all children using the bus network. Unfortunately, some school students have been exploiting the Government's position on the safe travel of school students by not paying the correct fare or displaying inappropriate / unsafe behaviour while on the bus, believing they will not be refused travel. Since COVID-19, this behaviour has increased to an unacceptable level and we are seeking your assistance.

The actions of an increasing number of students is causing safety & operational issues for bus operators such as ourselves, as dangerous behaviour by students can compromise the safety of themselves and others. As such, this type of student behaviour can no longer be tolerated.

Stakeholder Assistance

KBL continues to work with the Queensland Government and acknowledge that there is no simple solution to these complex policy related issues. We are seeking a collaborative approach by all stakeholders involved in the safe travel of school students to educate students on appropriate behaviour in and around the bus.

Resources

Bus Operators, Drivers, Parents, and Schools, public and private, each have responsibilities for ensuring safe school travel of students. To assist, a number of resources are available for schools to use, for example; during classes, in newsletters and for social media that focus on the bus safety message, including:

- Code of Conduct for School Students Travelling on Buses
- Redly Cod Bus Rules Program
- Road Safety Matters

If you would like to know more about these programs, please contact the office Kangaroo Bus Lines.

Top Tips

Here are four top tips for students traveling on school buses:

1. Arrive at your stop 5 minutes early;
2. Stand where the driver can see you;
3. Hail your bus early so the driver has time to stop safely. (to hail a bus, raise your hand to show that you'd like the bus driver to stop)
4. Have your go card or student bus pass ready.
